

# **Project GRAD Akron - Our 22nd School Year!**

Since September 2002. Project GRAD Akron has successfully partnered with the Akron Public Schools to positively impact the lives of thousands of students and families. In the fall of 2002, we began our journey with six schools in the Buchtel Cluster. In 2017-18, we piloted an expansion of services to North High School. During the 2018-19 school year, we expanded our services to the East Cluster. In the summer of 2021, Project GRAD Akron co-authored with the school district a federal GEAR UP (Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) grant to benefit the Akron Public Schools. In September of 2021, the Akron Public Schools was notified by the U.S. Department of Education that the District was awarded more than \$7 million for the 7-year life of the grant. Based upon the organization's vision, successful history, and evidence-based programs and services, Project GRAD Akron is the lead partner of the grant as well as one of the contractors. The grant afforded our organization the opportunity to expand our reach to include additional services for students and families, plus the addition of two additional clusters, the Garfield Cluster (formerly Kenmore-Garfield) and the North Cluster. Currently, Project GRAD Akron provides extensive programs and services to students and families in the Buchtel, East, Garfield, and North Clusters of the Akron Public Schools, positively impacting the lives of thousands of young people on an annual basis.

The **heart** of the work that we do is showing the students the pathways to a successful life. We help students make positive transitions through programs including our Bridge to Kindergarten program in collaboration with Kent State University; our College and Career Central (3C) classes and programming for 6th through 12th grades; our Summer Institutes in collaboration with the University of Akron and Kent State University: our GRAD Mentors program: our GRAD Helping Hub: our scholarships: and our GRAD Persists programs for our college students. Since 2006, Project GRAD Akron has awarded more than \$2.5 million in scholarships to graduates as they pursue a variety of post-secondary options as well as assisted them in leveraging thousands of dollars in additional funds!

#### **BRIDGE TO KINDERGARTEN (B2K) HIGHLIGHTS**

#### 2024 - 2025 Bridge to Kindergarten Summer Academy

#### Students and their Families Transitioning from home or preschool to begin their formal educational journey in Kindergarten

Since 2009, 601 students have successfully transitioned to an Akron Public School kindergarten classroom after completing Project GRAD Akron's Bridge to Kindergarten Summer Academy. We very much appreciate the




continued partnerships we have relied on over the years, including Akron Public Schools, Kent State University's Early Childhood **Education Department, Summit** Education Initiative, and for two years, ArtSparks. The 2024 - 2025 program began with the Bridge to Kindergarten Summer Academy, which was held this year July 22 through August 9, 2024. The **B2K** Summer Academy was held at Schumacher CLC (Buchtel Cluster), with a total of 34 students in two



classrooms. Students worked on building and strengthening their kindergarten readiness skills in literacy, math, social and

emotional learning, and transitions.





**Parents as Partners:** During the summer program, parent and caregiver meetings each week provided community/school resources for family wellness. Also there was an opportunity for parents to support each other. Speakers: Christine Sullivan - Summit Education Initiative, Trish Rice - Molina Healthcare, and Adriana Plank - MedWorks.

Our program continues during the school year with programming and wrap-around services for parents, caregivers, and students to ensure our families and students have their needs met for a successful start to their beginning journey in their formal education.

Thank you to Akron Public Schools, Akron Community Foundation, and Summit Education Initiative for your continued generous support of Bridge to Kindergarten.



#### PROJECT GRAD AKRON **INTERMEDIATE AND SECONDARY PROGRAMS**



Entrepreneurship Adventures Summer Program: 55 students from Buchtel and East CLCs. Students worked in teams to address a need and create a product to fill that need. The product was created and manufactured by students with the support of area entrepreneurs. This program was funded by The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce.

GEAR UP After-school Club: served 581 duplicated students in after-school social emotional skill building programming at Buchtel, East, Innes, and Jennings CLCs, and North High School.

GEAR UP Parent Academy: hosted a Parent Academy for GEAR UP Parents from the GEAR UP Schools, a total of 44 guests for breakfast and workshop on Trauma and Student Wellness presented by Red Oak Behavioral Health. 100% of parents



Class of 2024: 110 seniors at Buchtel and East CLCs were served through our classes. Of these, 73 students planned to attend college and completed 214 scholarship applications and were awarded over \$676,000.00 in scholarships.

**GRADs Persist:** 34 Class of 2024 graduates joined 37 current college scholars to participate in GRADs Persist, receiving on-going support services, including navigated campus-based services, mental health services, and financial aid services. 94% of students in the cohort agreed, "I know I can reach out to Project GRAD and its staff for academic and financial aid support".



Our middle and high school programs have been generously supported by United Way of Summit & Medina, The GAR Foundation, The City of Akron, The Ohio Department of Education and Workforces, ECMC Funding/NCAN (National College Attainment Network), and Akron Public Schools

#### Overview of outcomes for the 2023 - 2024 School Year:

Student participants in College and Career Central Classes: 1952 students at Buchtel, East, Innes, Jennings, and Garfield CLCs, and North High School. 98.7% of students agreed, "I learned valuable skills to succeed in college and career".

**GRAD Mentors Match Hours:** 1889.25 mentoring hours for 10th through 12 grade students at Buchtel and East CLCs.

Bridge to GRADuation: served 222 unduplicated students in school day and after-school programming to support Youth Violence Intervention and Prevention at Buchtel and East CLCs.



agreed, "Learning about the impact of trauma on students and how I can help my student was beneficial to me as a parent".

Writing for Your Future: In partnership with Kent State University, 38 Buchtel and East CLC Class of 2025 students participated in a campus residential summer program focused on preparing an essay for the Common Application.

## **Project GRAD Akron's Additional Scholarships**



#### Leon Harris Book Scholarships

The Leon Harris Book Scholarship was established in 2008. Mr. Harris, a Buchtel graduate, was the keynote speaker for the First Achieving Dreams Celebration Gala. He donated \$10,000 to fund the Project GRAD Akron Leon Harris Book Scholarships.



#### The Ken Walker Book Scholarship

The Ken Walker Book Scholarship benefits a Buchtel alumnus pursuing a degree at the University of Akron. Ken Walker (1951-2019) Ken graduated from Buchtel (Class of 1969) and earned his B.A. from U of Akron (Class of 1973). He built his life in Akron, marrying (Gwen) and raising a family, all the while remaining active in the community and nurturing strong friendships. He was athletic and particularly enjoyed playing basketball and executing his perfectly arced, nothing-but-net fade away jump shot. He served as a long-time member of several civic boards. Intellectually curious, Ken was an avid reader with a keen interest in political and social justice issues, Old English literature and sports biographies.



#### Atha & Muriel Walker Scholarship

The Atha & Muriel Walker Scholarship was established independently in 1997 for the benefit of Buchtel graduating seniors. In 2011, the family began awarding scholarships through Project GRAD Akron for Buchtel High School seniors. For decades, the late Mr. and Mrs. Walker were local leaders who were active in many community projects. Mr. Walker made a mission of helping raise funds for Buchtel projects through his association with the service group Frontiers International. He also assisted high school and college students with job placement. The Walkers' five children are all graduates of Buchtel High School and they have all earned college degrees.



#### The India Ola Douglas Memorial Book Scholarship

India Ola Douglas was a 2013 graduate of Buchtel CLC (High School) in Akron Public Schools. Active in school, she was a member of Project GRAD Akron. India was committed to pursuing her post-secondary education and she took classes at The University of Akron and Regency Beauty School. A hard worker, she was employed by JC Penney and as a consultant for Avon. Her ultimate goal was the pursue a career in fashion design. On May 6, 2015, India had just left home to attend classes. At 8:30am, while sitting in her car a red light, she and other cars were struck by a driver going twice the speed limit. On May 11, India tragically died as a result of injuries she sustained. The driver was later convicted of multiple offenses and sentenced to prison.

The India Ola Douglas Memorial Book Scholarship was established in 2016 by India's family and friends. The scholarship was the brainchild of India's brother, Donte Douglas, a 2008 Project GRAD Akron Scholar, 2008 Buchtel graduate, and a 2013 graduate of Muskingum College. He wants other students to "chase their dreams" as his sister was doing.



#### **Project GRAD Akron Carolyn Stokes Reed Memorial Scholarship**

Carolyn S. Reed was employed by the Akron Board of Education for 30 years, as a teacher at Robinson Elementary and principal of Rankin and Glover Elementary Schools. Mrs. Reed was the first African American to be elected president of the Ohio Association of Elementary School Principals and was a president of that Akron Elementary School Principals Association. Carolyn Stokes Reed knew she wanted to be a teacher since she was in the Second Grade. At the start of every school day for 16 years, as a principal Carolyn Reed would say, "This is the most important day of your life. Do your very best. Follow the directions of your teacher the first time they're given."

Mrs. Reed believed that whatever path you decide to follow, you make sure you do your best and be the best you can be. She believed if you had your education, you could write your own ticket in life. She was very involved in other numerous civic activities and achieved many honors. She is still remembered as a motivator, a lover of people and a lover of children.
